Alternative sequences for completing the program are available from the Department of Kinesiology and Physical Education. Teacher candidates complete a P-8 & 7-12 Kinesiology and Physical Education Major and a Health Education Minor. A grade of C or better is required in all KPED courses. A cumulative, major and minor GPA of 2.5 is required for admission, retention, and completion of the degree.

Teacher candidates must complete 30 hours prior to enrolling in KPED 2300. Teacher candidates must be admitted to the PETE program prior to enrolling in 3000 and 4000 Professional Education courses. Admission to the PETE program requires that teacher candidates have (1) passed the KPED Fitness Test (see departmental fitness sheet); (2) passed the Praxis I tests – passing scores are Reading 172, Math 171, Writing 174; (3) completed 38 hours of prerequisite course work (Math 1390 or higher, WRTG 1310 & 1320, SPCH 1300, KPED 1320, BIOL 1400/1440, H ED 2201, KPED 1125 and 1135 or KPED 22__, KPED 2250, KPED 2300, and KPED 2381) with a C or better; (4) a cumulative and major grade point average of 2.5 or better; (5) passed EDUC 1240 with a C or better or equivalency test; (6) demonstrated professionalism through membership and participation in professional student clubs and professional organizations and (7) received a passing grade on a developmental portfolio presented to the KPE faculty in the semester the student will earn a minimum of 52 semester hours. Teacher candidates must complete the admission process to the Physical Education – Teacher Education (PETE) program. Block 1: Upon acceptance into the PETE program, teacher candidates must purchase a subscription to Chalk and Wire, an electronic portfolio program required by the College of Education. Teacher candidates may purchase a one year subscription and then renew for a second year or purchase a two year subscription. During the 3rd fall term, candidates must enroll in KPED 2340 and 3330 concurrently. Fieldwork is required in these courses. **Block 2:** Fieldwork is required in KPED 3363. Candidates must receive an “acceptable rating” on the developmental portfolio during KPED 4310.

Block 3: During the senior year, teacher candidates are enrolled in course work and internships that require a minimum commitment from 8a.m.-5p.m. Monday through Friday. An extensive internship in the public school is required. To be admitted to Internship II, teacher candidates must pass the PRAXIS II specialty-area content exams. (Health and Physical Education Content Knowledge #20856 and Physical Education: Movement Forms-Analysis and Design #30092) The minimum passing scores are 144 and 150, respectively. Teacher candidates must submit to the KPE Department a copy of the full ETS score report verifying passage of the specialty-areas content exams prior to the start of the final semester of enrollment. Prior to graduation, teacher candidates must submit to the KPE Department a copy of the full ETS score report verifying completion of the Principles of Learning and Teaching Exam (PLT). To be recommended for teacher licensure, a teacher candidate must obtain a passing score of 164 on one of the following PLT tests: #30522 grades K-6, test #30523 grades 5-9, or test #30524 for grades 7-12. Each teacher candidate must receive a passing grade on a showcase portfolio presented to the KPE faculty and complete a departmental exit interview during the semester in which the teacher candidate applies for graduation. The showcase portfolio is part of the Internship II course requirements.

Add-On Coaching Licensure

The Arkansas Department of Education allows licensed teachers to add areas to a standard teaching license upon completion of an approved program of study and the appropriate Praxis II examinations. To receive a coaching license, coaching candidates must pass the Physical Education Content Knowledge Exam (#091) with a score of 149 and the following coaching program of study. A grade of C or better is required in each course in the coaching program of study. Coaching candidates must maintain current CPR/First Aid certification throughout the program of study. A copy of the certification card must be submitted annually to the academic advisor. A coaching candidate cannot be recommended for licensure without verification of current CPR/First Aid certification. The coaching program of study, current terms courses are taught, and prerequisites are listed below. Note some courses can be taught during the summer if enrollment warrants. Further information regarding the coaching license is available from the Kinesiology and Physical Education Department (Farris Center Room 120).

- ___ KPED 2340 Motor Development (included in major) (fall & spring) prerequisite: admission to PETE or KPED program or consent of instructor, co-requisite KPED 3330
- ___ KPED 2381 Anatomical Kinesiology (included in major) (fall, spring and summer) prerequisite: BIOL 1400 or 1410 with a grade of C or better
- ___ KPED 32 Coaching (select primary area of interest) (on demand)
- ___ KPED 3331 Care and Prevention of Exercise and Sport Injuries (fall, spring & summer) prerequisite: KPED 2381 or BIOL 2405 or 2406 with a grade of C or better
- ___ KPED 3382 Mechanical Kinesiology (included in major) (fall & summer) prerequisite: PHYS 1400 or CHEM 1402 or 1450 with a grade of C or better
- ___ KPED 4230 Fitness Assessment and Exercise Prescription (included in major) (fall, spring & summer) prerequisite: KPED 4300 with a grade of C or better
- ___ KPED 4300 Exercise Physiology (included in major) (fall, spring & summer) prerequisite: KPED 2381 or BIOL 2405 or 2406 with a grade of C or better
- ___ KPED 4395 Sport In American Society (fall, spring) prerequisite: junior or senior classification
